Co Mayo, Situated on the stunning west costs of Ireland, not far from Galvay and Knock airports, the hotel specialises in long beach treks at low tide on Murnisk and Bertra beaches, Imagine galloping through the surf, the wind ruffling your hair, with miles of unspoilt landscape surrounding you.
